Meet Triangle and all the other shapes in this hilarious picture book about friendships, fun, and finding your place. No matter how hard she tries, Triangle doesn't roll like the circles, or stack like the squares . . . so she sets off to find friends that look exactly like her. But when she finds the other triangles, playtime isn't as fun. She misses the shapes that roll and stack; she misses having friends of all shapes and sizes! Can Triangle get all of the different shapes playing and having fun together?

I love the message of inclusion and the recognition that our internal view affects us and how we feel we fit in. It is easy to understand the message through shapes.

Make your own mosaic



- Materials: card, scissors, glue
- **Activity**: Cut up lots of different shapes in different colours. Spend some time arranging your shapes onto a separate piece of paper. Once you are happy with your picture start to stick your shapes down.
- Why do it? This is a creative open-ended activity that is impossible to get 'wrong'. Whichever way you arrange your shapes is wonderfully unique to you!

Act out your shapes



- Materials: just yourself!
- **Activity**: Have a go at moving your arms and legs to see how many different shapes you can make with your body.
- Why do it? This is great for younger children and a chance to be silly and have fun.
